She's a <u>flight attendant</u> and comes back from work at the weekend. At half past six I go into my <u>study</u>, switch on my computer and answer some emails. After that it's time for my first coffee. About nine o'clock I have a phone call with my boss. I always <u>hope</u> that little Susie doesn't start <u>crying</u> in the middle of it. Before midday I go shopping and after that I <u>clean</u> the house. I don't have lunch, I have another coffee and a snack at the computer. Between two and three in the afternoon Susie and I go for a walk in the park. I always take my mobile so my boss or my colleagues can call me for information.



I start work again in the late afternoon and finish at about half past seven. At eight o'clock I <u>put</u> Susie <u>to bed</u>. After my evening meal I look at our two clocks in the kitchen. We have a London clock and a Toronto clock

because my wife works on the London-Toronto flight. When it's nine p.m. in London, she has her afternoon tea break and I can call her on her mobile phone.
